

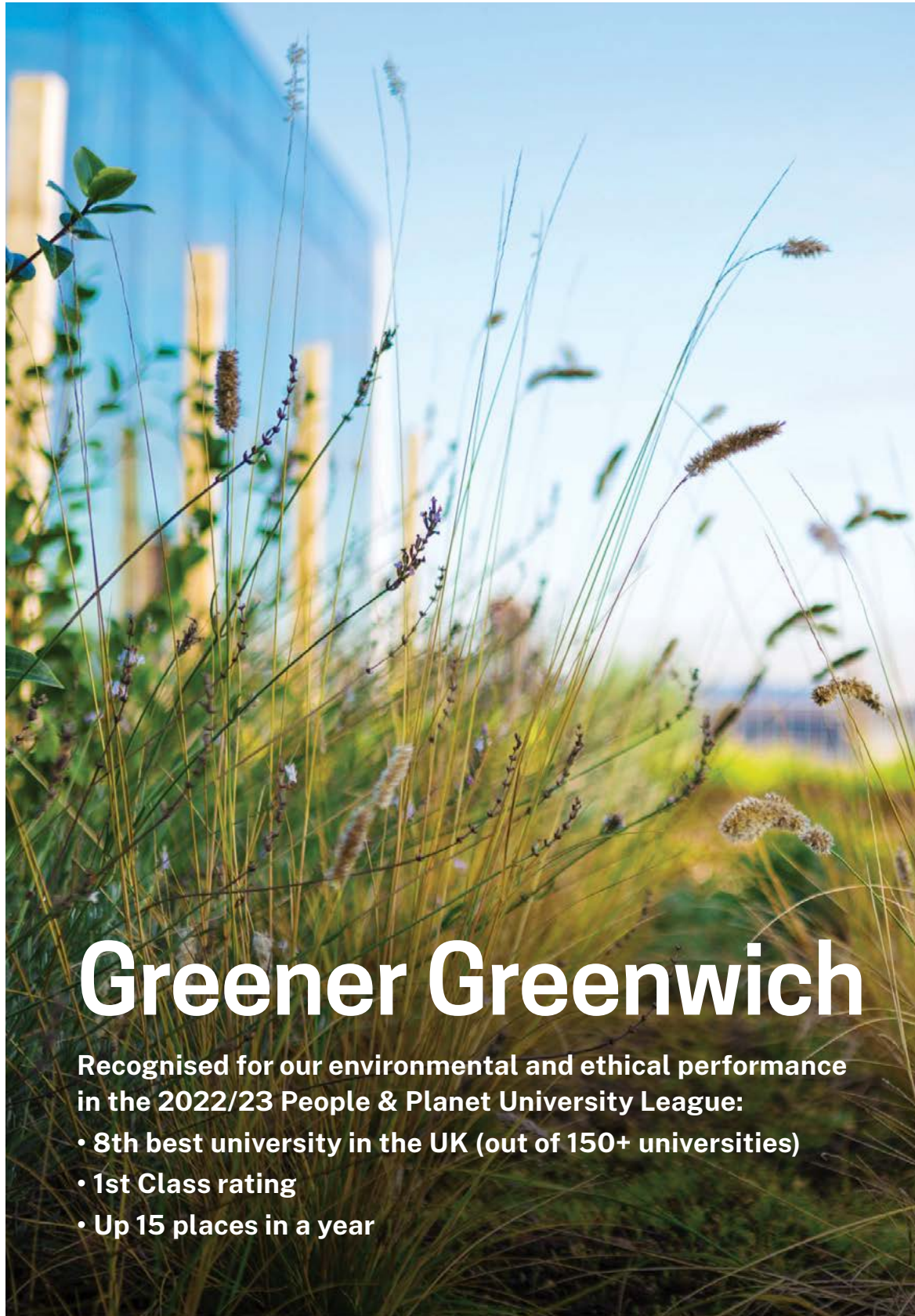

Greenwich Campus

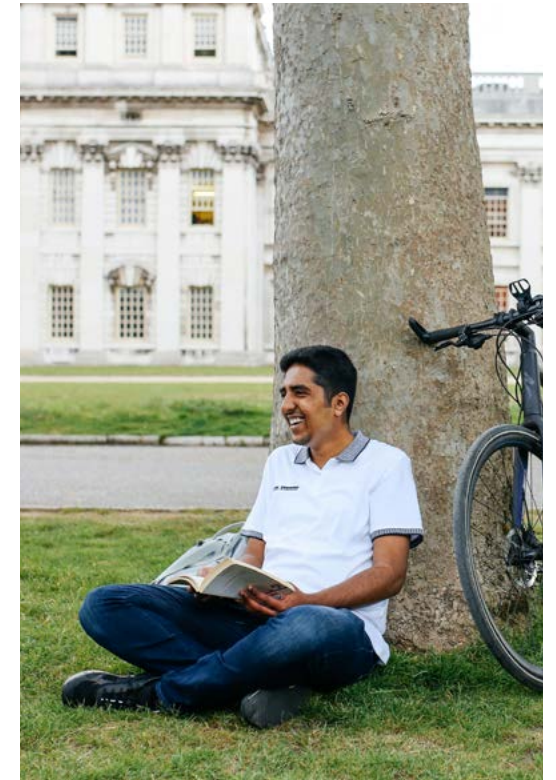

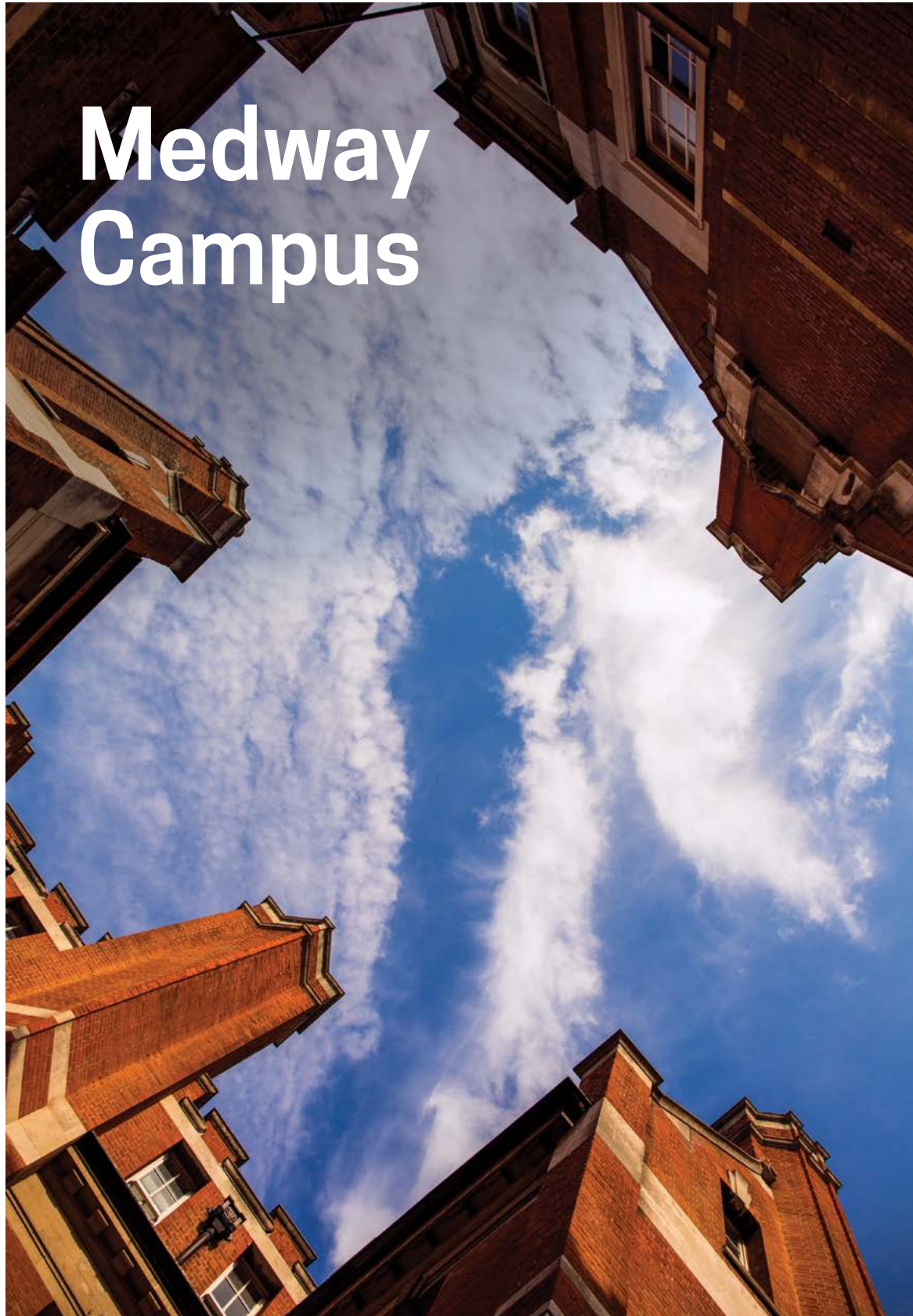

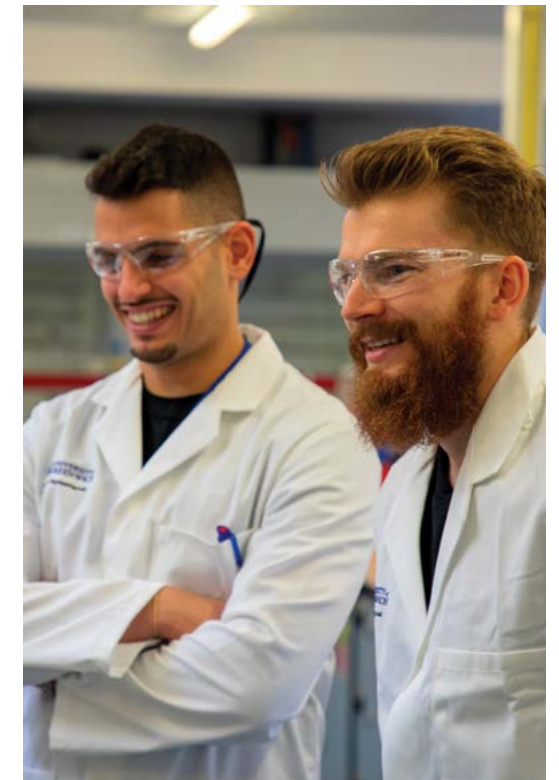

Your degree, your choice

What's important to you? Here are a few things to think about before you start your university journey.

I've got a busy life

Got career or family commitments? Have you thought about studying a part-time course, or an Elevate degree, where you attend campus one day a week? Our extended library hours, study skills sessions and online learning materials can also help.

I'd like to study abroad

We can help you study at an international summer school (for a fee) or partner university, or find a course with overseas fieldwork. You may be able to get a grant through the Turing Scheme.

I want to earn while I learn

You can work up to 20 hours a week on some courses or take a sandwich year. On a degree apprenticeship, you can study part-time while earning a salary. Many of our students support the work of staff across the university as student ambassadors.

I've got experience that's relevant to my degree

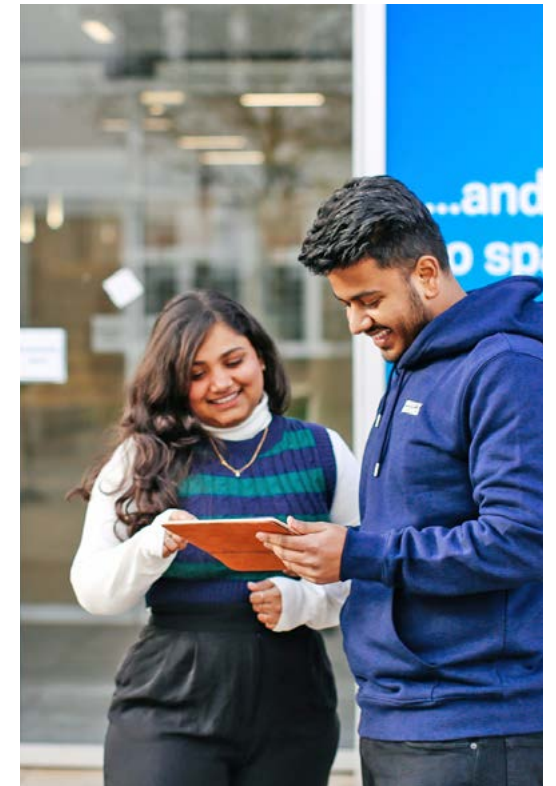
With the right experience, you may not need to complete all the course, or we may ask you to meet lower entry requirements. Just claim 'Recognition of Prior Learning' when you apply.

I need to boost my English skills

If you're an overseas student, you can begin your degree at the University of Greenwich International College (UGIC). We also offer pre-sessional English courses at the university.

I don't know if my qualifications are suitable

We accept lots of qualifications, including A-levels, T-levels, BTECs, Access courses and overseas qualifications. Yours isn't listed? Just get in touch! You may still be eligible to study with us.



I want to cut my study time

If you have the right qualification, such as a foundation degree, you may be able to go straight into the second or final year of your course.

I've got the ability but not the grades

You can study an extended degree with a foundation year. These tend to have lower entry requirements. Our partner colleges also offer foundation degrees.

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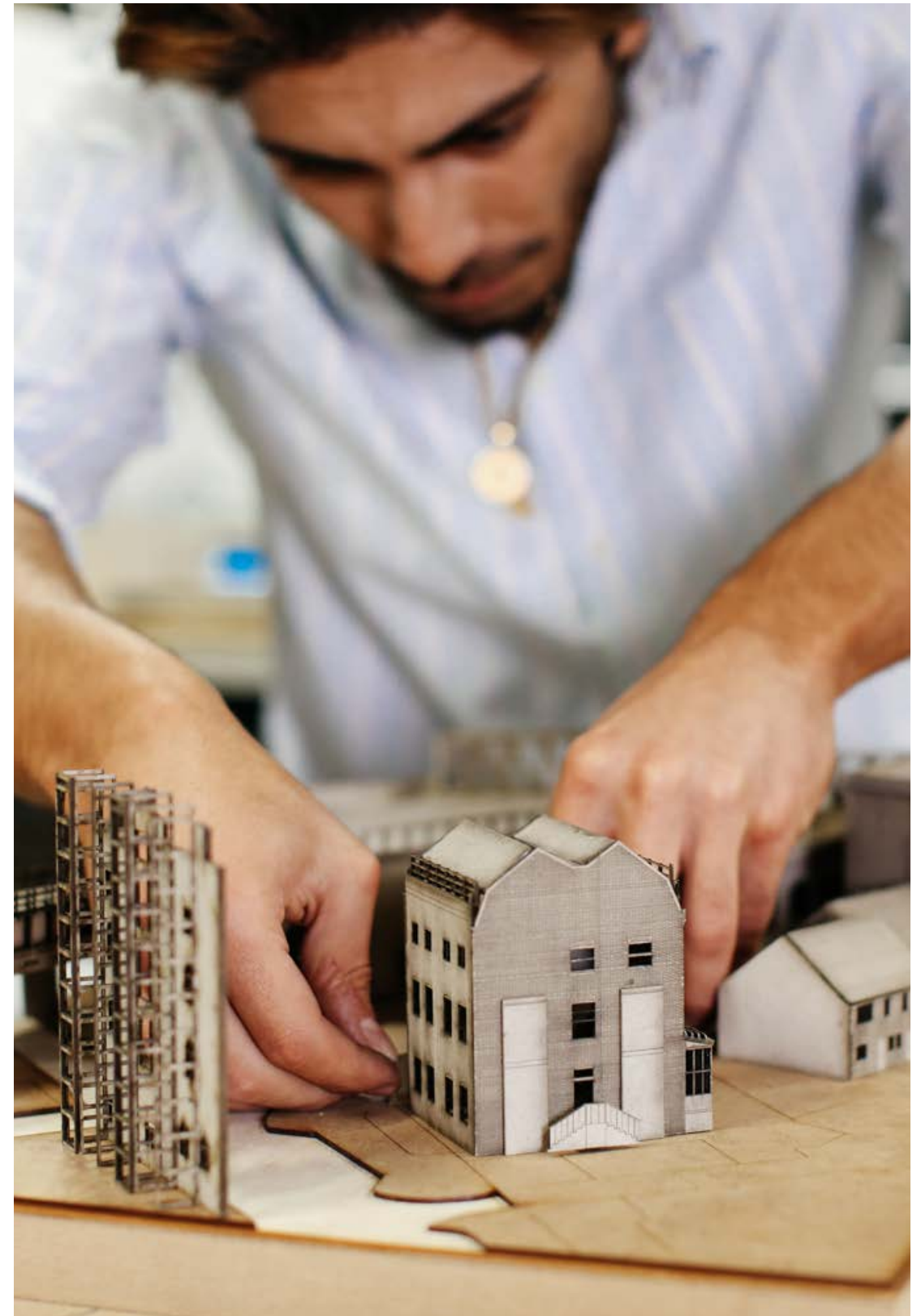

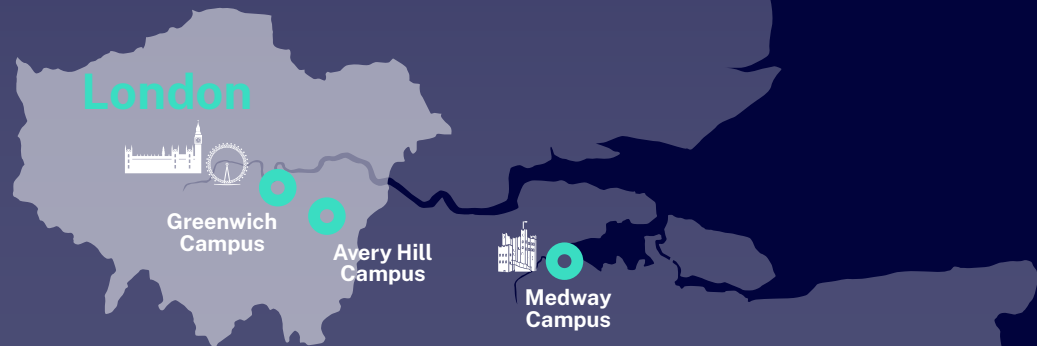

We make every effort to ensure this information is as accurate as possible at the time of publication. However, this information is subject to change over time and it is important that you check the university's website for the most up-to-date information. In particular, we will make a key update to the website by the end of Clearing 2023 (expected to be in October), which will give a more definitive description of the courses we plan to offer in 2024/25, though some changes may still be made later. Where changes have been made to the information published in this prospectus or online, any significant changes to a course will be notified to any prospective student who has registered an interest in the course and also notified to applicants at the time of making an offer. If you have any comments about the prospectus, please contact us at courseinfo@gre.ac.uk (UK students) and international@gre.ac.uk (international/EU students) as appropriate. The University of Greenwich will do all that it reasonably can do to provide educational services as described on its website and in this prospectus. Sometimes, circumstances beyond our control mean that we cannot provide such educational services. This might be because of, for example, industrial action by university staff or third parties, the unanticipated departure or absence of key members of university staff, acts of terrorism, the acts of any government or local authority, changes reasonably required by a professional, statutory or regulatory body (PSRB) or accrediting body, epidemic or pandemic of disease, academic changes within subject areas, or where the numbers recruited to a course are so low that it is not possible to deliver an appropriate

quality of education for students enrolled on it. In these circumstances, the university will take all reasonable steps to minimise the resultant disruption to those services, for example by making reasonable modifications, but to the full extent that it is possible in law, the university excludes liability for any loss and/or damage suffered by any applicant. The modifications we make may be to: the content and syllabus of courses, including in relation to placements; the timetable, location and number of classes; the content or method of delivery of programmes of study; the examination process; and the timing and method of assessment. Many of the changes that we make are in response to feedback from students and are intended to improve the experience of students and student outcomes. Where circumstances demand an unavoidable change or where it is necessary for the university to discontinue a programme of study, the university will take reasonable steps to minimise the effect for applicants and all significant changes will be notified promptly as set out above. Our Student Protection Plan (<https://docs.gre.ac.uk/rep/sas/student-protection-plan>) sets out the steps we will take to protect the quality and continuity of study for students. If you have any particular concerns regarding any proposed changes, you should make the university aware as soon as possible by contacting us via the email addresses provided above.

You should also be aware that some of the courses listed in the prospectus may be subject to final approval. In the unlikely event that a course is not approved by its start date, the course will not run and you will not be able to take up your place. Should this happen, you will be informed by the university and assistance will be provided to those who have been offered a place to find a suitable alternative course at the university. If a course is awaiting final approval,

this will be indicated clearly in the course listing entry in the prospectus.

The prospectus provides core information on our courses. As a student, you receive further material describing the teaching, examination, assessment and other educational services, and information on the social side of student life at the time that any offer is made to you and subsequently upon enrolment. Your application to the university will be considered in accordance with the university's admissions policy and procedure, which also sets out your right to complain if you are dissatisfied with the handling of your application. Should you go on to enrol as a student of the university, you will be asked to agree to the university's principal conditions of registration and your studies will be undertaken and governed in accordance with the university's student regulations, policies and procedures. Please note that the principal conditions of registration and the student regulations, policies and procedures are updated annually for the start of the academic year. While changes are not usually significant, the current year's versions should be treated as indicative and you should familiarise yourself with the documents applicable to your year of registration when you enrol. A summary of changes to regulations and policies is provided to continuing students at the start of each academic year. If you become a student, this notice shall constitute a term of the contract between you and the University of Greenwich. Any offer of a place is made on the basis that you consent to this notice as part of the contract.
